As we enter a new week, may we ask ourselves: Where is God inviting me to choose humility over recognition? How can I make someone else feel seen, valued and welcomed?

May our parish continue to be a community where there is always a place at the table for everyone, and where our faith is made visible through kindness, compassion and service.

Oblates of St. Francis de Sales



As we begin the Season of Creation, we are invited to renew our relationship with the gift of creation and to rediscover our vocation as stewards of the world God has entrusted to us. For Saint Francis de Sales, creation was never simply a collection of things around us. It was a book through which God reveals his goodness, wisdom and love.

In his Introduction to the Devout Life, Francis encourages Philothea to contemplate creation with wonder. The beauty of the heavens, the earth, plants, animals and the changing seasons can lift the human heart towards God. Creation becomes a school of prayer: when we look carefully at what God has made, we are invited to recognise the Creator.

This is very much in keeping with the spirit of his Treatise on the Love of God. Francis repeatedly presents God's love as something that precedes us and surrounds us. God is the source of all that exists, and everything in creation bears some reflection of his goodness. The created world is therefore not something to possess selfishly, but something received with gratitude, reverence and love.



For Francis de Sales, love changes the way we look at everything. If I truly love God, I cannot be indifferent to what God has made. The flower, the tree, the sea, the bird and the human person are all gifts that point beyond themselves to the generosity of the Creator. Creation calls us to move from possession to gratitude, from exploitation to stewardship, and from indifference to wonder.

There is also something profoundly Salesian in the way Francis sees God present in ordinary things. Holiness is not reserved for extraordinary moments. We encounter God in the circumstances of everyday life. In the same way, the Season of Creation invites us to discover God's presence not only in church, but in the garden, the ocean, the mountains, the rain, the soil and the ordinary beauty of our surroundings.

Francis teaches us that devotion must become practical. Love of God is demonstrated through the way we live. Our care for creation can therefore become an expression of the devout life. To waste less, to protect what is vulnerable, to care for the poor who suffer most from environmental destruction, to respect the natural world and to cultivate gratitude are not merely ecological concerns. They can become acts of Christian love.

Perhaps the most beautiful Salesian insight for this Season of Creation is that creation should lead us to praise. When we contemplate the goodness of creation, we are ultimately invited to say with the Psalmist: "How great is your name, O Lord our God, through all the earth!"

Saint Francis de Sales teaches us to look at the world differently: with the eyes of love. And when we learn to see creation as God's gift, we begin to treat it not as something that belongs to us, but as something entrusted to us.

May this Season of Creation help us to recover that sense of wonder. May we become grateful recipients rather than careless consumers, faithful stewards rather than possessors, and people who recognise in every created thing an invitation to love the Creator.

“Live Jesus” — and may the love of Jesus teach us to love, protect and cherish the beautiful world that God has placed in our care.

ITALIAN SAUSAGE, TOMATO & GREEN BEAN SKILLET

A hearty, rustic Italian dish made with juicy sausage, fresh tomatoes and tender green beans. Simple ingredients, big flavour!

Real Ingredients. Italian Flavour.



SERVES 4

INGREDIENTS

- 500 g Italian sausage
- 1–2 tbsp olive oil
- 3–4 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1 small fresh chilli, finely chopped (optional)
- 4–5 Roma tomatoes, chopped
- 300 g fresh green beans, trimmed
- Salt, to taste
- A handful of fresh basil leaves

METHOD

- 1 Heat a little olive oil in a large frying pan over medium-high heat.
- 2 Cut the Italian sausage into bite-sized pieces and add to the pan. Cook until nicely browned and coloured on the outside.
- 3 Add the chopped garlic and chilli. Cook for about 30 seconds, stirring so the garlic doesn't burn.
- 4 Add the chopped tomatoes and mix everything together. Cook until the tomatoes begin to soften and release their juices.
- 5 Add the green beans and season with salt. Stir well, then cover and cook for about 5–8 minutes, until the beans are tender but still have a little bite.
- 6 Tear in the fresh basil and give everything a final mix.
- 7 Serve hot, with plenty of the delicious tomato sauce spooned over the sausage and vegetables.

A little crusty bread on the side is perfect for mopping up that sauce!

Our 2026 theme, "Gathered to Grow, Sent to Serve", embodies this, gathering us for spiritual growth and sending us in mission—directly building toward next year's [2027] theme which is "Journey of Faith, United to Love" and our 40th anniversary celebration.
