As you read through this week's newsletter, may you find something that encourages you, challenges you, or simply reminds you that you are part of a parish family journeying together in faith.

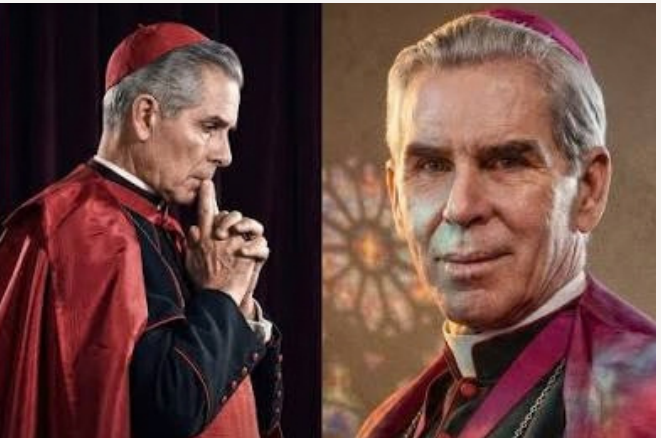
May the week ahead be filled with God's grace, and may we continue to be a community that welcomes generously, serves joyfully and shares Christ's love wherever we go.

Reflection

A Voice That Still Leads Us to Christ Reflecting on the Beatification of Blessed Fulton J. Sheen



On 24 September 2026, the Church celebrated a truly historic moment as Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen was declared Blessed Fulton J. Sheen during a solemn Beatification Mass in St. Louis, Missouri.

The celebration took place at The Dome at America's Center, a vast venue chosen to accommodate the thousands of pilgrims who had travelled from across the United States and around the world. What began as a celebration expected to draw tens of thousands ultimately saw approximately 50,000 faithful gathered together in prayer and thanksgiving. Among them were close to 90 bishops, around 1,000 priests, almost 250 deacons, and approximately 1,600 religious and seminarians. Pilgrims came from almost every state in the United States and from more than ten countries, demonstrating the extraordinary reach of Archbishop Sheen's ministry and the lasting impact of his witness.

The Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, formally granted the decree declaring that Fulton Sheen could henceforth be called Blessed. Representing the Holy Father at the celebration was Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle, Pro-Prefect of the Dicastery for Evangelization and Pope Leo XIV's papal delegate. Cardinal Tagle celebrated the Beatification Mass and delivered the homily, while the bishops, priests, deacons, religious and faithful gathered as one Church to honour a man whose life had been dedicated to proclaiming Jesus Christ.



It was a fitting setting for the Beatification of a man who understood the power of communication. Archbishop Sheen used the most modern means available to him in his time — radio, television, books and preaching — to bring the Gospel into people's homes. His television programme *Life Is Worth Living* reached millions of viewers, making him one of the most recognisable Catholic voices of the 20th century.

Yet Sheen's real gift was not simply that he could communicate. He knew what he was communicating. His purpose was never to draw attention to himself, but to draw people towards Christ.

Perhaps this is why his Beatification speaks so powerfully to the Church today.

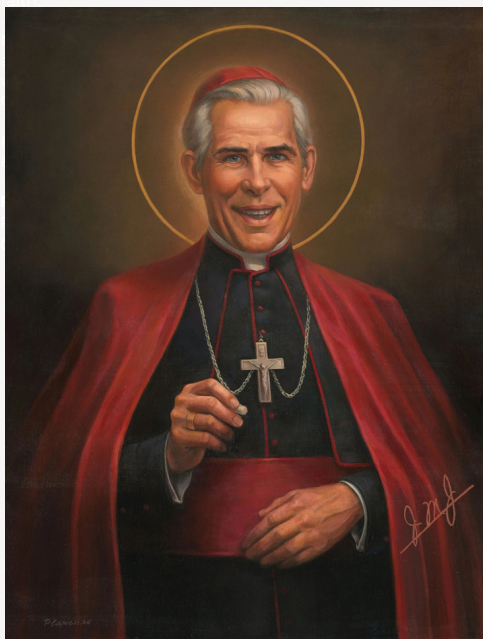
We live in a world filled with voices. Social media, television, podcasts and digital platforms allow almost anyone to speak to thousands — even millions — of people. We can communicate instantly, but the challenge is to ask: What are we communicating? And where are we leading people?

Blessed Fulton Sheen reminds us that Christian communication must ultimately lead people beyond ourselves and towards Jesus.

At the heart of his life was his profound love for the Holy Eucharist and the Blessed Virgin Mary. His public ministry flowed from a deep private life of prayer. Before he spoke to the crowds, he spent time before the Lord. Before he sought to change the world, he allowed Christ to change him.

That is perhaps one of the greatest lessons we can take from his life. Evangelisation does not begin with having the perfect words. It begins with having a heart that has encountered Christ.

And this mission belongs not only to priests, bishops or professional evangelists. It belongs to all of us.



Every parishioner has a mission. We evangelise through the way we welcome someone at Mass, the way we treat our families, the way we forgive, the way we serve, the way we speak about our faith and the way we respond when someone is struggling. Sometimes the greatest sermon we will ever preach will not be delivered from a pulpit — it will be seen in the way we live. The thousands gathered in St. Louis also remind us that the Church is never simply a collection of individuals. Bishops, priests, deacons, religious and lay faithful gathered together as one Body of Christ to celebrate a man who spent his life bringing people into a deeper relationship with the Lord.

Blessed Fulton Sheen once wrote and preached with a conviction that remained at the centre of his life: Christ must always be greater than ourselves. His Beatification is therefore not an invitation to simply admire a remarkable Catholic figure from the past. It is an invitation to continue his mission in our own time, using the opportunities and means available to us today.

As we rejoice with the Universal Church at the Beatification of Blessed Fulton J. Sheen, may we ask his intercession for our parish and for the Church throughout the world.

May we learn from his courage to proclaim the Gospel, his love for the Eucharist, his devotion to Mary, his commitment to prayer and his desire to use every available means to bring people to Christ.

And perhaps, above all, may we remember the simple message he wanted every person to know: God loves you.

May Blessed Fulton J. Sheen pray for us and inspire us to become courageous witnesses of that same love in our own time.

COOKING WITH Our Youth Minister: *Leo*

PASTA AL LIMONE *Lemon Pasta*

Fresh. Simple. Delicious.

A light, creamy pasta with the bright flavour of fresh lemons. Simple ingredients, big on taste!

Simple. Authentic. Italian. ♥



INGREDIENTS

- 400 g spaghetti or linguine
- 60 g unsalted butter
- 2 cloves garlic, finely minced
- Zest of 2 lemons
- Juice of 1½ – 2 lemons, to taste
- 125 ml heavy cream
- 75 g finely grated Parmesan
- ½ – 1 cup pasta water
- Salt, to taste
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 2 tbsp fresh parsley or basil, chopped



Leo's Tip

The secret to a really silky Pasta al Limone is the starchy pasta water. Add it gradually while tossing the pasta rather than making the sauce overly thick with cream.

METHOD



COOK THE PASTA

Bring a large pot of generously salted water to the boil. Cook the pasta until just al dente. Before draining, reserve at least 1 cup of pasta water.



START THE SAUCE

While the pasta cooks, melt the butter in a large frying pan over medium-low heat. Add the garlic and cook for about 30 seconds, just until fragrant.



ADD THE LEMON

Add the lemon zest and lemon juice. Stir gently and allow it to warm for about one minute.



MAKE IT CREAMY

Lower the heat and add the cream. Stir until combined and gently warmed — don't let it boil vigorously.



ADD THE PASTA

Transfer the drained pasta directly into the pan. Toss well, adding a little pasta water at a time until the sauce becomes silky and coats the pasta beautifully.



ADD PARMESAN

Remove the pan from the heat and add the Parmesan. Toss continuously until melted and incorporated. Add more pasta water if the sauce is too thick.



SEASON AND SERVE

Taste and adjust with salt, freshly ground black pepper and additional lemon juice if you want more brightness. Finish with fresh parsley or basil.
